## Terms of Reference and Introduction

In January 2006, Canadian Development Consultants International Inc. was retained by the Department of National Defence to undertake Fact-Finding Task # 1 (DND Contract Number: 05/0882 - Fact Finding Task #1). From the Statement of Work, the purpose of this project was, "... to develop a list of Canadian Forces (CF) and foreign military units and personnel and Department of National Defence (DND) employees who were present at Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Gagetown during the testing of Agent Orange, Agent Purple and other herbicides in 1966 and 1967, and during the periods from 1952 to the present day when spraying with herbicides was conducted."

The scope of work outlined includes a comprehensive list of units and individuals who were present at CFB Gagetown during the testing of Agent Orange, Agent Purple and other herbicides in 1966, 1967, and during the eight to twelve weeks per year from 1952 to 2005 when spraying with herbicides was conducted. The objective has been to compile objective and credible information concerning personnel who were present at CFB Gagetown when herbicides were used (estimated to be over 100 000 individuals).

From the outset the time-lines and scope of this project have been extremely challenging. Hard work, patience and persistence in the face of these challenges were key to meeting and exceeding expectations. Thank you to all who contributed to this project.



## Executive Summary

Between March 2006 and June 30, 2006, a team of researchers identified, located, data entered and reconciled more than **115 000**<sup>1</sup> records related to individuals who were stationed at Canadian Forces Base Gagetown between 1952 and 2005.

- More than **7000** Regular Force Personnel were identified as stationed at CFB Gagetown during Summer Training for the years 1966 and 1967
- **358** Civilians were identified as employed by CFB Gagetown for the years 1966 and 1967
- **806** family members were identified who may have been associated with the Regular Military and Civilian Employees for 1966 and 1967

For the approximately **101 800** Regular Force Personnel identified, we are able to provide the following information about these records:

- At least **75 700** have a Service or SIN number (which is required to undertake further research using other records or resources)
- At least **14 000** are still active members of the military
- Approximately **28 000** were stationed at CFB Gagetown after 1986<sup>2</sup>
- About **22 500** were stationed at CFB Gagetown before 1966
- **27** are known to be deceased
- More than **27 000** records contained addresses, phone numbers or email addresses

## Challenges with the Records

For this project, no one record provided an individual's complete history of postings, occupation(s), rank(s) or unit(s) served. Nominal rolls, newspaper sources, *PeopleSoft* queries, information from Veterans' Associations and other sources provided 'snapshots' of individual records and were collated by researchers.

Given the nature of the historical records accessible to researchers and the challenges regarding time allotted to complete the database, the final database may contain records that require further research. More than 48 000 duplicate records were identified, reconciled and removed from the database.

During the project, researchers consistently updated and modified records to reflect multiple duty dates, family information or more details about individuals such as current contact information. There were more than 48 000 updates made to the records data that were entered at the Federal Records Centre alone.

## Missing Records and Information

In April 2006, CDCI estimated the population of CFB Gagetown from 1954 to 2005 at 315 000 (an average of just over 6176 new military and civilian postings or visits to the Base annually over the fifty-one year period of military activity on-site).

- It is estimated that 98 000 cadets trained at CFB Gagetown. About 1400 cadets are identified and recorded in the final database dated June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2006. In consultation with officials from Camp Argonaut, no nominal rolls or other records could be



readily located. Camp Argonaut opened in 1972 and Annual Historical Reports estimated that 2000 - 4000 cadets trained on Base each year. This record was taken into consideration when providing the estimated number of cadets at CFB Gagetown.

- Library and Archives Canada holds both military and civilian personnel files. At no time did CDCI have access to these records for this project. Alternative sources were used to develop a profile of regular military, civilian personnel and family members where possible.
- Throughout the 1950s, the 1st Canadian Infantry Division held Summer Concentrations at Camp Gagetown. Part II Orders exist for the participating units, but other than a small number of individuals, they do not specify exactly who served during the exercises. The *Gagetown Gazette* was not published until June 1962. As a result of this lack of documentation, the number of regular force personnel identified at Gagetown is lower than the April 2006 estimate for the 1950s and early 1960s. Please see **Table 4**.

## Data Collected and Analysed

*Regular Forces (Personnel):* This category represents any regular military personnel identified using the historical sources outlined in **Appendix G**. Soldiers teaching at the Combat Arms School/Combat Training Centre, members of lodger units, and soldiers within units of the 1 Canadian Division (2 and 3 Canadian Infantry Brigade Group) provided the majority of names collected.

*Reserve Forces:* Members of the Canadian Militia who were posted to Land Forces Atlantic Area Training Centre, or trained on the Base. Reserve Force Members were identified in pre-1968 records with the single digit prefix noted before their service number.

*Contractor:* Individuals who may have undertaken work at CFB Gagetown under contract to the Federal Government. This may include individuals hired to spray herbicides, clear bush, pave roads or construct and maintain buildings and other infrastructure at the base. It would also include individuals contracted to perform specialized services including research and human resources.

*Civilian Employee:* A non-military, non-public fund employee hired by the Department of National Defence or another Federal Government department working at CFB Gagetown.

*Visitor:* Any individual listed in newspaper sources and guest books as having visited the base. If further research is completed, this category may include civilians visiting Base recreational facilities and individuals authorized to hunt or pick berries in the training area.

*Summer Student:* Any individual specifically noted as being a summer student.

*Cadet:* Any member of the Sea, Army or Air units of the Royal Canadian Cadet Corps training at Camp Argonaut or in other areas of CFB Gagetown.

*Foreign Military:* During summer training, several Foreign Military units were stationed at the base. Foreign military units are listed in Appendix C. No nominal rolls were included in this database.

### Breakdown of Records by Years From MS ACCESS Database Dated June 30, 2006

As mentioned in the methodological notes that follow, researchers pulled together information about individuals posted to, visiting or employed at Canadian Forces Base Gagetown, using a diversity of sources. However, the sources had serious limitations in terms of the breadth and the accuracy of the information provided. For example, not all records capture the exact dates when an individual was posted to CFB Gagetown or when they left the base.

It should be noted that the database submitted with this report is fluid and will be subject to updates and changes over time. This report provides analysis of the material as it stands on June 30<sup>th</sup> 2006. If additional data or amendments are added it is essential that the statistical analysis be re-tabulated. In order to provide a more accurate estimate, numbers associated with the database may be rounded up to the nearest 100 when appropriate.

## Methodological Notes

### Background

Before engaging in the challenge of identifying personnel at CFB Gagetown, it was necessary to undertake background research in recent publications on the subject of Agent Orange, Agent Purple and herbicide use at the base. These publications, from diverse sources, have been compiled in reference binders. The material includes Canadian Forces backgrounders and Agent Orange articles located on Government of Canada websites, and documents pertaining to the Statement of Claim for the Class Action suit filed against the Government of Canada. One hundred and seventy-three articles published by Canadian news outlets between June 2005 and January 2006 were reviewed. Additional web-based articles and *blogs* containing animated discussion on the use of Agent Orange on Canadian bases, including pages from The Black Watch Regimental Association, Free Dominion, and Legion Magazine were also analyzed. These pages not only discussed Agent Orange, but also revealed individuals who can be further researched for inclusion in the final database. Finally, House of Commons and Senate *Hansard Debates* relating to Agent Orange were collected for this project.

## Historical Records Consulted

### *Defence History and Heritage (DHH), Ottawa*

The records at DHH contain two sources useful in determining CF Units and Personnel at Gagetown, 1952-1988. The first source, the *Canadian Army Journal* (1953-1963, 1965) contains articles noting personnel and Summer Camp activities at Gagetown. Sixteen articles have been culled from the *CAJ*. The documents identify units participating in the Exercises held during Summer Concentrations of the 1<sup>st</sup> Canadian Infantry Division (1954-1958) and its component units 2 and 3 Canadian Infantry Brigades at Camp Gagetown to 1965 after which time the sessions were re-designated as “Collective Training”.

Significantly, the second source, comprised of Unit Annual History Reports (AHRs) provided key contextual information regarding units stationed at CFB Gagetown. From the AHRs, sixty-eight units were identified as being posted to Gagetown in strength. Their AHRs were reviewed from the year the unit had initial training or was stationed at the base through to the most recent AHR. The AHRs include, at minimum, a list of officers stationed at Gagetown and unit personnel strengths. In some cases, depending on the number of personnel in the unit or the historical foresight of the Commanding Officer, the AHRs include miscellaneous Nominal Rolls, lists of visitors, records of key events for a particular year and notices of personnel postings. A list of Annual Historical Reports reviewed for Task One appears in **Appendix E**.

### ***Library and Archives Canada***

At the outset of this project, an electronic search of Library and Archives records from RG 24, Department of National Defence records was completed. Roughly 550 files were identified using *ArchiviaNet*. The search terms included Gagetown; personnel; nominal; rolls; postings; Oromocto; and unit names. More than 70 000 pages from 400 files were reviewed yielding more than 7500 names. Information about firms contracted to provide services at CFB Gagetown was also collected.

### ***Federal Records Centre (FRC) Tunney's Pasture***

The Federal Records Centre at Tunney's Pasture in Ottawa houses the Part II orders for Canadian Army Regular Force Units from the 1940s until the end of 1966. The records contain the following information:

- Service numbers
- Surnames
- Initials
- Unit Particulars (ie. Company of the unit in which the individual serves)
- Promotions
- Awards
- Postings and dates of leave
- Amendments to Pay and Position
- Re-engagement notices and compulsory retirement ages
- Family/next of kin contact information and particulars
- Medical and disciplinary notices

Each Part II order is organized alphabetically by soldier's Surname, and each entry is numbered. A soldier's name appears in the order only when an event occurs to require an entry to be recorded (ie. if their service particulars change). The records are stored in volumes of approximately 200 pages each.



Units stationed at Gagetown were identified from the Annual Historical Reports at Defence History and Heritage section. The references were then cross-referenced against the Part II Finding Aid held by Library and Archives Canada. In early May CDCI was provided with a copy of the 264 page finding aid to expedite requests.

The initial research at the FRC focused on the year 1966. The First and Second Battalions and Depot of the Royal Highland Regiment of Canada; HQ 3 Canadian Infantry Brigade; 2 Field Squadron Royal Canadian Engineers; 3 Signals Squadron; HQ CFB Gagetown (including Base Royal Canadian Army Service Corps; Royal Canadian Ordnance Corps; Royal Canadian Mechanical Engineer Corps and the Station Hospital); the Royal Canadian Dragoons; the Experimental Service Battalion; 2 Personnel Depot and; 1 Royal Canadian Horse Artillery were the major units on station during 1966. For 1966 the detailed particulars of each soldier noted in the Orders were recorded. In most instances, the entries required multiple updates as soldiers were posted to and from base; relocated their homes; were attached for training; were married or had children; or had changes to their rank, occupation or pay scale. On rare occasions, the Part IIs contain an order that lists all personnel in the unit.

After reviewing the 1966 material, Part II orders were selected that would identify the maximum number of personnel for this project. Units were selected that would provide a greater cross-section of unit type (Artillery, Armour, Infantry, Engineers, Support Services and Signals). The Orders from HQ Camp Gagetown and the Camp Orderly room were entered in detail from first through last. The 1/8 Canadian Hussars based at Gagetown in the late 1950s was also completely reviewed. Selected volumes of documents from the base lodger units were also entered.

Approximately one half of all records in the Agent Orange database were culled from the Part II Orders at the FRC.

### ***CFB Gagetown Visit in March 2006***

Over a ten day period in late March 2006 research was undertaken at 3 ASG/CFB Gagetown and environs. The trip was useful as several thousand names were gleaned from unit nominal rolls, a Base Locator, the Base Gagetown and Area Fact-Finder's Office and from various publications at the base museum and in the departments of the Town of Oromocto. However, the trip did not produce as much information as was hoped as the active units do not maintain many records for longer than a 3-year period. For a summary of the resources available in Gagetown/Oromocto please see **Appendix D**.

### ***Canadian Forces Joint Imagery Centre – A Squadron National Research Council – Ottawa***

A search of photographs at the CFJIC was undertaken in April 2006. Over 1200 images were identified as being taken at Camp Gagetown. A review of all of the captions to the photographs produced just over 600 new names for the database.

### ***Gagetown Gazette***

CDCI obtained access to approximately 300 issues of this weekly newspaper that included the years 1962 to 1967, 1970 to 1971, 1973, 1976 and 1980-81. Names of visitors, family members and regular military personnel were noted as much as possible with the limited material provided. About 14000 names were recorded using this source. Although the weekly serials did not contain service numbers, they did contain particulars about visitors and notable events on base.

## Breakdown and Explanation of the Estimated Number of Records for Task#1

At the outset of this project, in order to gauge the amount of data entry required and to assist the work planning process, an estimate of the number of records associated with the final database was calculated using archival records, published reports and material provided by DND. The following numbers were gathered:

1. CF Members/Veterans	315 220
2. DND Civilian Employees	25 000
3. Contractors, Summer Students	to be determined
4. Military Family Members	76 000

As noted, these numbers have been derived from archival material located at DHH, NDHQ, lists provided electronically by the Department, the Outreach Coordinator's Office, Library and Archives of Canada records; published sources like the *Gagetown Gazette* (starting in 1962); and databases and spreadsheets provided by units and veterans' organizations.

Base Annual History Reports estimate that there were 10 000 to 11 000 visitors on the base per year through the 1980s and 1990s. However, no documentation has been located yet that will assist with identifying the names of these visitors.

### 1. Estimated Total Number of CF Members

Research and sources provided the basis for the estimated 315 000 names of possible individuals who may have been posted to or who may

have visited CFB Gagetown between 1954 and 2005. Unfortunately, time constraints, Nominal Rolls that were not located and challenging records only permitted CDCI's research team to identify roughly 115 000 individuals. More time and access to military personnel records would assist with filling in many gaps, particularly relating to the Cadets.

## **2. Civilian Information**

Civilian information was gathered from records primarily provided in paper and electronic form from DND. These records were also snapshots of an individual's time at Gagetown or in some instances, records that indicated their personnel records were being transferred to the Library and Archives of Canada. Their personnel files were not reviewed.

Please note that the information recorded in the final database and the estimated number of civilians employed at the base between 1952 and 2005, does not include civilians living in the surrounding area who may have obtained permission to hunt, fish, pick berries or to use the on-base recreational facilities at CFB Gagetown. There are a number of sources that may assist with identifying these individuals, however, time constraints prevented further research.

As well, in 1999, a number of refugees from Albania and Kosvo were located at Camp Argonaut, adjacent to CFB Gagetown. Very little information material or details about these individuals were included in the final analysis of this phase of the project.

### **3. Contractors and Summer Students**

Information regarding contractors may already be captured in the civilian numbers. Clarification of the definitions of contractors and civilians may assist with providing this number.

All information gathered to date with regard to summer students indicates that two groups of 'students' attended the base annually. 2000 to 4000 cadets per year are mentioned in annual historical reports. However, few lists or nominal roles have been located. This material may exist in Halifax. CDCI was provided with a list of about 1200 cadet instructors who taught at Gagetown from 1975 onward.

In the 1960s, one weekend each summer, approximately, 2000 local Boy Scouts encamped at Blissville. Scouts Canada has been unable to

provide further information. However, when and if this information is located, their numbers should be captured in the civilian statistics.

Further research and information regarding Military Occupation Code (MOC) and Military Occupations Structure Identification (MOSID), may reveal more records that may be classified as either contract workers or summer students.

#### **4. Estimates of Family Members at the CFB Gagetown from 1954 to 2005**

Based upon Oromocto Census information and changes to the population over time, it is estimated that from 1954 to 2004, there were about 76 000 family members associated with the Base.

The final database contains as much information as possible about individuals and their families as was available in published sources and records collected for the project. For example, newspaper sources and individual calls to the Department of National Defence provided more detailed family information for the years 1966 and 1967 in particular. Overall, more than 8100 records contain information about spouses, children and/or an individual's marital status. Consequently, information about an additional **10 000** people may be located in the June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2006 MS ACCESS database.

## Additional Work Required

As noted, the June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2006 MS ACCESS database is fluid and requires data reconciliation in order to standardize a number of fields and to reflect information collected for this project. There are at least 7300 known records that contain duplicate Service or SIN numbers. Information about when personnel started or ended their term at CFB Gagetown, occupation(s), rank(s), and units served should be combined into one unique record.

There are also a number of formatting inconsistencies that could not be fixed for the final deadline. These inconsistencies include the use of upper case letters for surnames and given names; inconsistent use of periods with initials, missing hyphens in family names; no standard drop down menu for occupations and the use of codes to describe personnel occupations; standardizing information regarding multiple years; fixing any date problems and finally an overall quality control of the database.

Finally, as has been noted, this project was undertaken with extremely challenging deadlines and expectations. Only a fraction of the material available was accessed. In particular, additional research using the Part II orders at the Federal Records Centre should be undertaken. About one-third of the material was reviewed and often obtaining an individual's name was a higher priority than completing their service information. As well, there are still many untapped sources at the Library and Archives Canada that includes the following sources:

1. RG 24, Department of National Defence Subject Files
2. RG 38, Department of Veteran's Affairs, Subject Files
3. Newspaper sources, obituary records and city directories





4. Military Personnel files
5. Civilian Personnel files

Access to personnel files, both military and personnel was not an option for this project within the deadlines provided. However, with the information collected regarding regular force and civilian employees who worked at the base in 1966 and 1967, about 8000 records should be accessed to validate and obtain more complete information. This research should be much easier with Service and Social Insurance numbers located.

## Conclusion

The research undertaken for this project has been completed under less than ideal conditions and time constraints. Several gaps should be noted. In particular, very little information has been located regarding summer students, foreign military personnel<sup>7</sup> and contractors. Moreover, no information was collected regarding those individuals who were given permission to hunt, fish or collect berries on the base during summer training. More time would be required to obtain additional detail about local residents' access and use of CFB Gagetown.

Completion of this report and the MS ACCESS database is a strong foundation for future work that may be required by the Government of Canada. The final analysis and the number of records captured in the June 30<sup>th</sup> database exceeds the expectations initially set out for this project.

### MS ACCESS Database for T1 – Agent Orange

#### Minimum Fields from Statement of Work, Annex A

- a. ID #
- b. Date (when individual was at CFB Gagetown, including multiple occasions, if any)
- c. Name of individual (and service number if available)
- d. Whether individual is alive or deceased (if information is available)
- e. Individual's military unit)
- f. Type of military service (Regular Force, Reserve Force, Cadet, Foreign Military)
- g. Type of Civilian employment (DND indeterminate employee, term employee, contract personnel, summer student, Non-Public Fund employee, Other Government Department)
- h. Individual's military occupation or civilian classification
- i. Other relevant information obtained from file review or from other sources

#### CDCI Inc. June 2006 MS ACCESS Field Definitions and Comments

There are thirty fields in the final MS ACCESS database. They are described in detail below. MS ACCESS automatically generates an automatic ID field.

##### a. Service or Social Insurance Number

Depending upon the source used, records have either a unique service number or social insurance number. This number can be used to undertake further research using archival files and may assist with validating personal information given the duplication of family and given names. The Service number evolved over time from a number containing a single or double letter prefix (Z for Officers, two letters for Regular Force and a single letter for Militia) and one to 6 numbers to the SIN (after the unification of the Canadian Forces) to a single letter prefix with eight numbers. The civilian service number evolved from a range of miscellaneous identifiers to the SIN and ultimately changing April 1 1994, to a Personnel Record Identifier (PRI).

**b. Personnel Type**

This field is a drop-down menu and combines elements from fields 'f' and 'g' listed in Annex A from the original SOW. This field can be searched by the following terms: Regular Force; Reserve Force, Contractor, Civilian Employee, Visitor, Summer Student, Cadet, Foreign Military, Non-Public Fund Employee. The kind of information in Nominal Rolls, published sources and other documents used to populate the database did not provide the level of detail outlined in 'g' and consequently, could not adequately be captured at this time.

**c. Surname (Family name)**

This information may be hyphenated as noted in original documents. The use of all caps is inconsistent because some data that was imported used all caps. and there was not enough time to change this formatting in the final database. Not all entries have been converted from Caps to lower case due to the low priority of this change, and that queries in the database will not be affected by upper/lower case.

**d. Given Name**

This information may be hyphenated as noted in original documents. The use of all caps is inconsistent because some data that was imported used all caps and there was not enough time to change this formatting in the final database. In a few cases, the given name contains several initials as this was the only information provided in the original material.

**e. Other Names**

This field includes initials, nicknames or shortened names as indicated in the original sources.

**f. Multiple Years**

This field is a drop-down menu that has the option of "Yes", "No", or "Unknown". The information in this field may be used to isolate those individuals who may have been posted to Gagetown on several occasions. This field may also assist with identifying records that require additional research.

**g. Gagetown From (Start Date) mm/dd/yyyy**

As much as possible, this field was used to capture the date when an individual was first located at CFB Gagetown. This field serves as a point of departure for the date ranges associated with individuals at the base. Many excel sheets provided these date ranges in duplicate record form. As time permitted, data was reconciled in an effort to enter only one record per individual in the database.

**h. Gagetown To (End Date) mm/dd/yyyy**

This field is populated with the last date an individual was known to be located at CFB Gagetown. Depending on the types of records, individuals may have been stationed at the base for a short term, they may have been visiting, teaching or living there. Many excel sheets provided these date ranges in duplicate record form. As time permitted, data was reconciled in an effort to enter only one record per individual in the database.

The dates associated with fields 'g' and 'h' provide a broad date range depending upon the source used to populate the fields. When possible, more accurate or detailed information was captured in the multiple duty dates field. In some cases, as noted, individuals may have only been at the base for several hours, days or weeks at a time and that time may have been outside the summer training period between May and September each year. These fields are a starting point of information and more work is required to further refine the information collected.

**i. Multiple Duty Dates**

This field captures the details associated with fields 'f', 'g' and 'h'. As time permitted, researchers were instructed to note the period, years or months when an individual was at a base that could span over a period of thirty years. For example, some individuals may have been posted to the base during summer training for several years. The outside dates may include February 1967 to November 1972. This field may indicate that they attended summer training in 1967 and 1969 only.

**j. Unit(s)**

This field contains a drop-down menu. When an individual served in multiple units, best efforts were made to acknowledge this information with dates. A list of Units serving at Gagetown appears in **Appendix B**.

**k. Military Rank(s)**

This field contains a drop-down menu. When an individual held different ranks during their tenure at CFB Gagetown, best efforts were made to acknowledge this information with dates. A list of units appearing in the Military Ranks field appears in **Appendix D**.

**l. Occupation(s)**

Civilian and Military Occupation Codes (MOCs), descriptions and MOSIDs were imported or data entered. When individuals held different occupations throughout their tenure at CFB Gagetown, best efforts were made to acknowledge this information with dates. Data reconciliation of this field will help to more thoroughly analyse the range of occupations.

**m. Family Information**

Some sources provided information about an individual's marital status or if they had children. When this information was available it was noted using the following drop-down menu: married, single, divorced, spousal information, children, spousal information/children, marital status/children, unknown.

In some instances, people provided details about their family when calling the 1800 Call Centre or the Outreach Coordinator's Office or through a veteran's association.

**n. Military Family Unit (Number)**

This number field ranges from 1 to 10 and is used to tally the number of individuals noted in each family. If no information was available, the number defaulted to 1.

**o. 1966 or 1967 Base Information**

This field is a drop-down menu that has the option of “Yes”, “No”, or “Unknown”. The information in this field may be used to isolate those individuals who may have been posted to Gagetown in either 1966 or 1967. This field facilitates researching the dates when several chemicals were sprayed on the base. It further refines the searches using date ranges in instances when Gagetown From (start) or Gagetown To (end) dates were not available.

**p. Source**

This field contains the source used to populate the fields in each record. In some cases, the location of the source is identified, for example, the Library and Archives Canada, and in other cases, the MS Excel sheet or published source is identified. Further information about the diversity of sources is available in **Appendix G**.

**q. DND Comment Field**

Researchers were directed to contextualize information collected to populate the database fields. This field contains information that will assist in the identification of individuals for whom Gagetown From (start) or Gagetown To (end) dates were not available, or when a service number was not located. These comments may be edited or deleted as required. The field contains restricted personal information and is for the sole use of the client (DND).

**r. DND Comment Field II**

Early data entry templates did not contain a DND comment field, as this was not a required field specified in the Statement of Work. A comment field was included in the templates to help researchers locate an individual’s address. However, as the range of information became apparent in the research, it was decided to recode this field to DND Comment Field II. This field may contain restricted personal information and is for the sole use of the client (DND).

As most of the postal codes were provided via a number of DND MS Excel worksheets, there are no spaces between the six characters.

This drop-down menu contains three choices: 'Alive', 'Deceased', or 'Unknown'. When this information was available, researchers populated the field. When DND MS Excel sheets noted an individual was still active, they were noted as 'Alive'.

**bb. Date of Birth mm/dd/yyyy as available****cc. Date of Death mm/dd/yyyy as available**

## APPENDIX F

### Canadian Army Part Two Orders - Federal Records Centre Ottawa

The following list details Part II (Administrative) Orders of the Canadian Army. The volumes are maintained at the Federal Records Centre, Tunney's Pasture Ottawa, Ontario. These documents were reviewed between April and the end of June 2006. Due to the extensive detail and volume of information contained within each record set, research and data-entry was prioritized under three criteria: 1) 1966 (the *Gagetown Gazette* published estimates of 5000 troops taking part in the Summer Collective training August 15 – September 16); 2) potential for the identification of the greatest number of individuals in the shortest amount of time, and; 3) a cross-section of service types – Infantry, Artillery, Armour, HQ, Engineering and Service branches.

The Part II for units participating in 1 Canadian Infantry Division / 2 and 3 Canadian Infantry Brigade Group Summer Concentrations 1954-1965 and 1966 Collective Training were located and reviewed. These Orders did not immediately identify who participated in the Exercises and remain available for further analysis.
